Health Policy

To maintain the health of everyone, no one (child, staff, sibling/other family member and/or visitor) with the following symptoms is to be in the clinic or at an offsite visit:

- A temperature over 99 degrees. Temperature should be normal for at least 24 hours before the individual returns to the clinic;
- Vomiting, and/or diarrhea within the previous 24 hours;
- Coughing, sniffling or a runny nose with green or yellow discharge (many communicable diseases begin with these symptoms and are most contagious at this time);
- Eyes that appear reddened and/or are crusted, unless a doctor's note indicates it is not a communicative conjunctivitis (e.g., pink eye);
- Any undiagnosed rash or skin eruption, unless a doctor's note indicates it is not communicable;
- 24 hour institution of appropriate antibiotic treatment or symptomatic improvement (or as recommended by physician);

Treatment sessions are not as effective if a child is ill and others are likely to be exposed to possibly contagious illnesses. Please consider the following symptoms prior to your child's session:

- Sore, red throat, swollen glands:
- Earache:
- Acts listless, drowsy, headachy, appears flushed, has lack of appetite, or shows any behavior that
 is
 out of the ordinary.

For the health of all, it is important to contact the Clinical Director/Sarah Rosten of any contagious disease/conditions with which your child is diagnosed or known to be carrying. These may include, but are not limited to:

Strep throat Scarlet fever, rheumatic fever Impetigo Ringworm

Scabies Conjunctivitis (pink eye) Fifth's disease Lice

Tuberculosis Chicken pox or shingles Hepatitis Measles, mumps, rubella

If any of the above symptoms are observed in your child, we will ask you to bring him/her home. This also pertains to children in the waiting room. Additionally, our therapists may leave an offsite/home visit upon notification of any illnesses. This policy is for the protection of your child, other children at the clinic, and the staff.

Please alert your child's therapist of any changes in you child's health status, such as allergies, diet or medications. Current medical information must remain on file at all times. Minor injuries will be cared for by the therapist and you will be notified. Staff will administer no medications. In the case of an emergency, you will be notified immediately. If you leave the clinic while your child is in session,
